Geocaching Policy of the National Trail Parks and Recreation District

- 1. Written permission in the form of a permit from the National Trail Parks and Recreation District must be obtained before placement of any cache on Park property. There is no permit fee.
- 2. Each cache will be issued a permit number. The cache or container must be labeled on the outside with the issued permit number. Each geocache must have a separate permit even if the same person is applying.
- 3. A permit is valid for one year. After the expiration date, the cache must be re-permitted or removed and archived
- 4. Geocachers will have access to all NTPRD parks, but there will be an allowable limit.
 - A. Neighborhood Parks: 1 cache
 - B. Community Parks: 3 caches
- 5. Placement of a cache must be within 15 feet of the edge of a trail. No hikers are permitted off trail/bushwhacking in any of the NTPRD parks.
- 6. NTPRD has the right to set a limit of caches in one park and will deny future requests on grounds of effective management. After one year of placement, it is NTPRD's right to ask for removal of a cache which would make an opening for other cachers to make placement.
- 7. NTPRD must be notified when a cache is moved or eliminated.
- 8. No burying or climbing is permitted; caches must be at ground level. Cutting trees, shrubs or plants is also prohibited.
- 9. Container contents must be legal and suitable for all ages.
- 10. The cache owner is responsible for care and monitoring of the cache while on NTPRD property. Please monitor often enough to determine if clues or physical features are current.
 - (Monthly is recommended).
- 11. Caches placed in NTPRD parks must be available to the public via a public website. Caches for private access will not be accepted.
- 12. All NTPRD park rules must be followed including the use of parks during daylight hours only.
- 13. Any geocache found by NTPRD not in compliance with these rules or determined not to be in the best interest of the Park District will be removed and permit revoked.
